**REQUIREMENTS FOR SATISFACTORY PROGRESS TOWARDS THE DEGREE IN SOCIOLOGY:**

1. To be considered as making satisfactory progress toward the sociology major, students must have completed SOC 1004, STAT 3604, and at least 9 additional credit hours in Sociology upon having attempted 72 semester hours overall.

2. Students must also have an in-major GPA of 2.0 after having attempted 60 semester hours overall. (This includes freshman rule/course withdrawal courses.) **All courses designated with the SOC course pre-fix are calculated in the in-major GPA**

**NOTE:** There are no pre-requirements hidden within these requirements.

## CURRICULUM FOR LIBERAL EDUCATION

**Foreign Language Requirement:** Passing three years of a single language in high school satisfies the requirement. If a student has NOT completed at least two years of a single foreign language in high school, this credit must be in addition to the 120 credits required for graduation.

- Area 1:** Students may complete by taking ENGL 1105/1106. Students will complete SOC 4194, Senior Seminar, to meet the university ViEWS requirement.
- Area 2:** Students may select any two courses listed under the Area 2 University course listing. If you choose SOC 2024 then you also **must** take AFST 1714. Courses listed in Areas 2 and 6 may not count for both areas.
- Area 3:** Students may select any two courses listed under the Area 3 University course listing.
- Area 4:** Students may select from courses listed under Area 4 University course listing (ex. BIOL 1005/1006). Only 6 credits needed. No lab requirement.
- Area 5:** Students may select from the following course sequences: Math 1015/1016, Math 1205/1206, or Math 1525/1526.
- Area 6:** Students may select any 3-credit course from the Area 6 University course listing. Courses listed in Areas 2 and 6 may not count for both areas.
- Area 7:** Students may select any course listed in the Area 7 course listing. **A course taken to satisfy another area of the Curriculum for Liberal Education that is listed within Area 7 will satisfy the Area 7 requirement simultaneously.**
